SUMMER TAXES

FLOOD INSURANCE RATE MAP REVISION UPDATE

The process of gathering the detailed information needed for the topographical (land contours) maps took sixty days longer than anticipated. This data along with the bathymetric (river contours) have been converted to hard copy maps by Lapham Engineering and transferred to Mill Road Engineering, the engineering firm that Boyce Hydro LLC has provided to do the flood water intrusion calculations. This data will be returned to Lapham Engineering by April 15 for reconversion into new hard copy maps. Lapham will then complete all the necessary LOMR forms and submit them to FEMA for approval. All engineering parties involved are in constant contact with region five FEMA representatives.

MUNICIPAL WATER UPDATE

Civil Engineering has collected all the field survey data. Base plans are approximately 85% complete and include utility information, property lines, parcel numbers, and existing physical features. Civil Engineering also has a preliminary design of the water main completed on the east side of the Lake south of Curtis Rd. Specifications and contract documents are approximately 50% complete. The second public hearing will be held in the summer.

SANFORD LAKE WEED UPDATE

In 2010, the treatment strategy for lake weeds may be similar to the 2009 treatment with Aquatic Nuisance Plant Control spraying herbicides and algaecides on Milfoil, Curlyleaf and some additional native pondweed species and algae. This treatment will cost approximately \$90,000 for the year.

WANT BETTER ROADS?

Edenville Township will be seeking voter's support this November to approve a Road Millage. We have several roads in our township including Baker, Fike, W. Shaffer and Levely that are beyond poor condition and need to be pulverized and resurfaced. With the State revenue sharing cuts to our Township and County the only way that we see to fund these \$120,000 per mile projects is to supplement the limited highway funds with a small road millage.

Approval of a .4 road construction millage would generate approximately \$30,000.00 per year which with the Township road fund and County matching funds would allow the Township to still maintain current roads and reconstruct a targeted road each year.

The cost of a .4 millage on a home with a taxable value of \$50,000.00 is \$20.00 a year. (The average taxable value for residential property in Edenville Township is \$58,000.00 which would cost \$23.20 in taxes with a .4 road millage). Please consider this in November.
