- Call meeting to order and pledge to the flag done at 5:30pm.
- Township Board attendance by roll call (verifying quorum)

- Approval of agenda:

- comprised of people a lot better off than I am. I am not in favor of these assessments on residents or the township. Some folks won't stay until the lakes come back; and who knows if the lakes will come back at all, depending upon ensuing litigations.
- Ms. Anonymous— regarding the at-large assessment, if the FLTF receives the dollars they are seeking, will the Township and/or the residents get their money back? What happens if the legislation isn't passed until after the assessments are already applied.
- Mr. Anonymous—litigation is not going to be passed by December, so we are going to have to pay. Who is our local representative?
 Mark Boone has much more money than I do, and he is making decisions for me? Transparency is key—if we are not represented fairly, they have to answer our questions.
- o Robert McManus—have you heard anything about 30% of the cost being forced out to the rest of the County (not just the Townships directly connected to the lakes). Perhaps that would help light the fire to motivate other folks to be involved.

 - Report given— small lots are non-buildable, so ordinances should be re-visited.
 - T.Hall moved to fill the vacancy on ZBA with Tim Dana.

- Mitigation of Invasive Weeds/bottomland maintenance
 - Daryl Marsh present to represent John Marsh.
 - A.Lewis read J.Marsh's email regarding removal of surface lake bed debris for remaining 75 contractual hours. T.Hall praised J.Marsh's work thus far. A.Lewis moved to approve J.Marsh to utilize the remainder of contractual hours (75) to remove the

surface debris from the lakebed; T.Hall seconded. Voice vote: motion passed unanimously.

- All things Weed Assessment
 - Set Date for Public Hearing in April 2022 on the Weed Special Assessment—roughly \$38,000 left in the weed fund; can come to the Supervisor to request funding for having lake bed mowed in front of your property.
 - In April, we need to re-allocate the amount for the Weed Assessment. These monies would be to further weed mitigation in the coming years before the lakes come back.

- Discussion ensued. K. Carey moved to adopt Resolution 2022-04 which opposes the incorporation of Edenville Township. A.Lewis seconded. Roll Call Vote to approve resolution 2022-04: J.Sperling: Yes; K.Carey: Yes; T.Hall: Yes; C.Starkey: Yes; A.Lewis: Yes. Motion approved unanimously.
 - Clerk will follow up on legal requirements

 - Clerk A.Lewis said she would put this on the Township website
- Re-Card all voters in Edenville Township presented by A.Lewis
 - Discussion ensued— a company will do this for everyone in the county provided each Township agrees to do this.
 - A.Lewis moves to approve that Edenville Township opts in to the county voter-card re-print at a cost of .23 cents

per card (x 2,500 residents = \$575) plus postage. J.Sperling seconded.
